

Archives ACT Finding Aid Courts Functional History

Introduction

From its founding in 1913 until 1989, the Commonwealth Government administered the Australian Capital Territory (ACT). In 1989 ACT self-government came into effect. The archives that were created by the Commonwealth Government administration of the ACT, being Commonwealth records, were within the domain of the National Archives. Subsequent to ACT self-government, the ownership of some of these archives was transferred from the National Archives to the ACT Government.

ACT Law Courts & Tribunals

The ACT Law Courts & Tribunals consists of three agencies, namely the Supreme Court, the Magistrates Court and the Coroner's Court. In addition, there is the ACT Civil and Administrative Tribunal. The jurisdictions for each of these Courts and the Tribunal are outlined below.

ACT Supreme Court

The ACT Supreme Court is a superior court of record, and is the senior court of original jurisdiction in the Australian Capital Territory. Established as a superior court of record by the *Seat of Government Supreme Court Act 1933*, it commenced on 1 January 1934. The principal reason behind the establishment of a Supreme Court was to relieve the High Court of its original jurisdiction in respect of the Australian Capital Territory and to provide an intermediate court of appeal between the High Court and the Court of Petty Sessions (est. 1930).

Justice Lionel Oscar Lukin was appointed a Judge of the Supreme Court on 25 January 1934 and remained the sole Judge of the Court until November 1943. Justice Lukin was also a Judge of the Federal Court of Bankruptcy at the time and therefore did not sit full time on the Territory Supreme Court.

The first sitting of the Court was held at Acton House Courthouse on 12 February 1934. The first two matters heard by Justice Lukin involved actions for the restitution of conjugal rights. Lukin J. made the "usual order" that the wife return to her husband within 21 days. The first eleven cases heard were all concerned with matrimonial disputes.

The first recorded appeal to the Court from the Court of Petty Sessions was heard by Lukin J. on 29 August 1934 and involved allegations of illegal gambling activities.

The Supreme Court has unlimited civil and criminal jurisdictions, and exercises an appellate and supervisory jurisdiction in respect of the ACT Magistrates Court and the ACT Civil and Administrative Tribunal. Appeals from the Supreme Court lie to the ACT Court of Appeal.

ACT Magistrates Court

The ACT Magistrates Court has jurisdiction to deal with criminal charges laid against persons who are **over** the age of 18 years and hear and determine civil matters up to the value of \$50,000.

ACT Coroner's Court

The Coroner's Court was established by the *Coroners Act 1956* and continues in existence under the *Coroners Act 1997* (<u>http://www.legislation.act.gov.au/a/1997-57/default.asp</u>). The role of the Coroner's Court is to conduct inquests into deaths and inquiries into fires and disasters.

ACT Children's Court

The Magistrates Court is known as the Children's Court when it is exercising jurisdiction under the *Children and Young People Act 2008* (<u>http://www.legislation.act.gov.au/a/2008-19/default.asp</u>). The Children's Court has jurisdiction to hear criminal cases against children (people under 12 years of age) and young people (people 12 years and above who have not turned 18 years of age) and applications and other proceedings under the *Children and Young People Act 2008* in relation to children and young people.

ACT Civil and Administrative Tribunal (ACAT)

The ACAT provides a forum for the determination of a wide range of civil disputes, requests for review of administrative decisions and professional and occupational disciplinary matters. The ACAT commenced on 2 February 2009. It took over the work of a number of existing tribunals and boards including: the Administrative Appeals Tribunal the Small Claims Court the Discrimination Tribunal the Guardianship and Management of Property Tribunal the Mental Health Tribunal the Residential Tenancies Tribunal the Liquor Licensing Board the Health Professions Tribunal the Legal Practitioners Disciplinary Tribunal ACT Court of Appeal Case Records

These bodies no longer operate. Orders they made are taken to be orders of the ACAT. The records of the former tribunals are held by the ACAT.

ACAT also assumed responsibility for disciplinary proceedings relating to builders, electricians, plumbers and other licensed construction occupations, motor vehicle dealers, tobacco sellers, finance brokers, surveyors and architects and for the resolution of unit titles disputes and all civil disputes involving amounts under \$10,000.

Commonwealth Records Series

Commonwealth Record Series (CRS) are used as a descriptive control method to provide information as to who created a record, when it was created and link it to other records dealing with the same function. This provides contextual information to the record.

CRS is used to track the Commonwealth Government agency responsible for the records creation and the individual items within the series which is searchable on the National Archives of Australia's database here: http://www.naa.gov.au/The_Collection/recordsearch.html

Record series group records resulting from the same filing process or having similar content. For example series A7424 relates coronial fire files.

Commonwealth Agencies are the bodies responsible for performing administrative functions creating records in the process. A CA (Commonwealth Agency) number is used to identify individual agencies. For example CA 1360, [Australian Capital Territory] Courts Office Branch - Magistrates Court

Individual records are identified by the number or symbol allocated to them when they were created. For example the Coronial `SK` Fire files, single number series with `SK` prefix and year suffix.

Series notes for series A7421

This series contains buff coloured files marked with "SK" number on the top right of the cover and are marked with the words "Coronial Death Inquiry". The name of the deceased is also written on the file cover.

The "SK" file contains the Coroner's Report and statement. Inside the "SK" file is a second file the cover of which is marked with the "CD" number, "Inquest Brief", the name of the deceased, and coroner's name. Documents included in the "CD" file are Coroner's Report, authorisation for burial, admission to mortuary, file creation request, autopsy report, papers relating to inquest and evidence relating to the coroner's inquest which includes photographs (in colour from 1978).

Series notes for series A7424

These files combine an outer file, with an `SK` prefix, which contains the coroner's ordinance and a request for file and the inner file, which is identified by a `CF` [Coronial Fire] prefix. The inner coronial file contains such material as the file report (police), coroner's ordinance (report), statement of findings and a copy of the letter requesting the file. Files are registered for each case but only made up if the matter goes to inquest, hence there are gaps in the range of file numbers. The file covers are buff in colour with the `SK` number marked on the top right corner. It is also identified by the words `Coronial` and `Fire` on the cover, the name of the person involved and the coroner's name. The series is controlled by an `SK` prefix and a single number with a year modifier.

The numerical control, which started at 152/1960 continued through to 2850/1974. The 1975 files do not seem to be extant and the section of records controlled by SK 2856 - SK 3587 have no year modifier, but are presumed to cover the period from 1978-1986.

Series notes for series A7422

This series contains files relating to coroner's inquests into deaths. The file covers are marked with "Inquest Brief", the name of the deceased and the coroner's name. The control number is marked on the top right hand corner of the file cover with an identifying "CD" prefix. Documents which are included in these files are the file creation request, the coroner's report, authorisation for burial, admission to the mortuary, autopsy report, papers relating to inquest and coronial inquest evidence which includes photographs (in colour from 1978).

This series is subsequent to the Coronial "SK" dead files and replaces it. The files are the same as the inner "CD" files from the Coronial "SK" dead files.

Series notes for series A7423

These diaries contain entries broken into chronological order. The first part of the diary is an alphabetical index of names with addresses and "SK" file numbers. The cross-reference "CF" and "CD" numbers are written in red on the right of the entry.

The second part of the diary is listed by "SK" number, date, type (fire or death), name of the deceased and the coroner's decision. This cross reference diary controls the "SK" death files; "SK" fire files; and "CD" files.

Series notes for series A951

This series consists of files relating to application cases heard in the Court of Petty Sessions, Canberra. Each file contains correspondence, forms and legal documents which vary according to the nature of the application.

Examples of the types of application cases included in this series are as follows: restoration of drivers licence, maintenance, variation of maintenance order, approval of second-hand dealers licence, collectors licence, auctioneers licence, appeal against determination of the Commissioner for Commonwealth Employees Compensation, registration as a conscientious objector, consent to marry, condemnation of a firearm, warrant of possession of a dwelling, fair rent, ejectment order, stay of proceedings, committal of an individual to an institution. Applications for adoption orders are included in pre-1955 files.

Each file cover records the following details: registration number, name of the applicant, nature of the application, date of hearing and other action taken.

As part of this transferral, this series was withdrawn from Archives' custody in March 1995.

Agency notes for agency CA 572

Notification of the creation of the position of Registrar (Titles and Courts), Third Division, Canberra was gazetted on 29 January 1931.

It seems, however, that a temporary position existed from 1 May 1930 when the Deputy Registrar of Titles and Registrar of the Valuation Court was transferred from the Federal Capital Commission to the Attorney-General's Department.

The Courts and Titles Office was renamed the 'Courts and Registration Offices' on 29 July 1964. The Office's records consist of summons, cases and judgements in the Court of Petty Sessions, applications for naturalization, adoption and exemption from service,

applications for permits and licences in the Licensing Court, registers of firms and companies, cases in the Supreme Court, probate records and records of the Registry of Births, Deaths and Marriages and the Industrial Registry.

Agency notes for agency CA 823

The Courts and Titles Office was renamed the Courts Registration Offices on 29 July 1964. Anthony William Wynne was appointed Registrar and Clerk of the Court in December 1964 (1). In 1970 this agency was split into the Courts Offices Branch (CA1360) and the Registration Offices Branch (CA 1361). The agency's records consist of files of the Supreme Court, Court of Petty Sessions and Registry of Companies, Firms, Securities, Business Names and Co-Operative Societies.

As a consequence of the change in ownership, records, which may have been attributed to this agency would now be in the custody of the ACT Government.
