

Archives ACT **Finding Aid Community organisations**

Introduction

The social history of the ACT is rich and varied especially in the provision of volunteer community based organisations. As well as sporting clubs, Boy Scouts and Girl Guides and service clubs there are also many non incorporated associations, clubs and societies. Some community organisations have had a history written¹. Where this has occurred ACT government archives may add a different facet to the organisation's own records. Many groups were based in the Griffin Centre from the 1960s to 2005 and a list of some of these has been published.² Some records and archives are quite specific³ and other sources may be tangential⁴.

Questions you may want answered: When did the organisation start? Where did it meet? What government grants did they receive? Who were the office bearers?

Incorporated associations are meant to lodge annual returns with the Office of Regulatory Services. On application these returns will be searched by officers of the Office of Regulatory Services for a fee:

What government grants did they receive?

The financial relationship between an organisation and the government is also a source of historical information. However, according to the authorised records disposal schedules financial records are kept for 7 years. Files of unsuccessful grant applications are not kept by government agencies. For business reasons, once the grant has been acquitted, files are not generally kept regarding successful grants. Some files have serendipitously survived. For example:
