



# Canberra Canoe Club

## BURLEY GRIFFIN BASH SATURDAY, 28 FEBRUARY 1987

WHAT IS IT? The BASH is four canoe races on Canberra's Lake Burley Griffin.

1. 30km for experienced or competitive canoeists.
2. 14km for less ambitious or "fun" canoeists.
3. 14km School Cup team event for teams of three single kayaks representing a school in the Canberra Region.
4. 2km for boys and girls aged ten years and under.

WHERE IS IT? The start and finish line for all events is on Molonglo Reach opposite the Royal Military College, Duntroon. Access is from Moreshead Drive.

WHEN IS IT Saturday 28 February. The 2km event starts at 11am and all 14km and 30km events start at 12 noon. Competitors are asked to arrive between 9 and 11am to register and have their boats checked to ensure that the start is on time.

### RULES

- \* All competitors must be able to swim.
- \* Each boat must have adequate floatation.
- \* Each boat must be inspected by an official before going on the water.
- \* All competitors must assist any other competitor(s) in difficulty.
- \* All competitors must carry a life jacket throughout the event and wear it if instructed to do so by an official.  
(Lake Burley Griffin becomes very rough in windy conditions.)

NON COMPLIANCE WITH THESE RULES MAY LEAD TO DISQUALIFICATION.

CLASSES Every class of canoe or kayak is invited to enter the BASH. Each class is divided into groups (men, women, mixed) and further divided according to age. THERE MUST BE THREE BOATS IN A CLASS TO CONSTITUTE THAT CLASS. If you enter a class in which there are less than three entries you will have the opportunity to upgrade your entry. Time records will also be recognised in the original entry class.

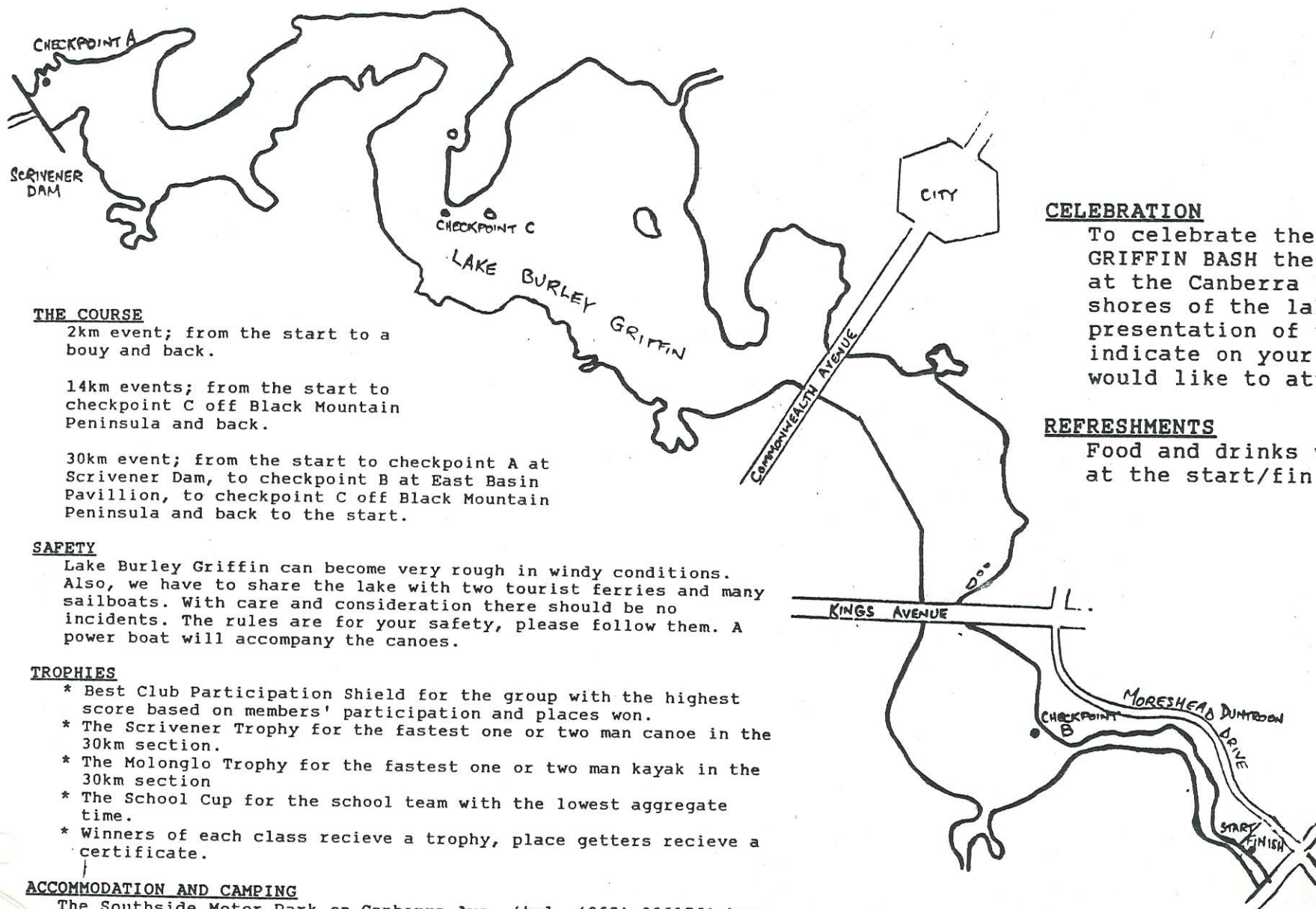

## FEES

Ten years & under - no fee  
Juniors(17 & under) - \$3 per paddler  
Open and Veteran - \$4 per paddler  
Entries received on the day are subject to a \$1 late fee.



## THE COURSE

2km event; from the start to a buoy and back.

14km events; from the start to checkpoint C off Black Mountain Peninsula and back.

30km event; from the start to checkpoint A at Scrivener Dam, to checkpoint B at East Basin Pavillion, to checkpoint C off Black Mountain Peninsula and back to the start.

## SAFETY

Lake Burley Griffin can become very rough in windy conditions. Also, we have to share the lake with two tourist ferries and many sailboats. With care and consideration there should be no incidents. The rules are for your safety, please follow them. A power boat will accompany the canoes.

## TROPHIES

- \* Best Club Participation Shield for the group with the highest score based on members' participation and places won.
- \* The Scrivener Trophy for the fastest one or two man canoe in the 30km section.
- \* The Molonglo Trophy for the fastest one or two man kayak in the 30km section
- \* The School Cup for the school team with the lowest aggregate time.
- \* Winners of each class receive a trophy, place getters receive a certificate.
